SOUTH AFRICA Noxolo Nogwaza

RAPED AND MURDERED FOR LGBTI ACTIVISM

Noxolo Nogwaza was a 24-year-old mother and activist for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex (LGBTI) rights, living openly as a lesbian woman in the KwaThema township near Johannesburg. In the early hours of 24 April 2011, Easter Sunday, she was murdered on her way home from a night out with friends. Her attacker(s) raped and repeatedly beat her – apparently because of her sexual orientation – before dumping her body in a drainage ditch. To date, no progress has been made in the investigation into her murder and her killer(s) remain at large. The apparent indifference that the police have shown towards investigating her murder reflects pervasive homophobic attitudes in the wider society.
