BLINDED FLEEING CIVIL WAR

Fourteen-year-old Ali Özdemir was blinded after being shot in the head while trying to cross into Turkey from Syria in May 2014. Ali and nine other Syrian refugees were attempting to rejoin his family in south-eastern Turkey, where they had been living during most of the Syrian crisis. They had not paid smugglers to take them across. After treatment in Syria and Turkey Ali was granted a visa to join his mother in Germany in June 2014; his father and two siblings were reunited with them in March 2015. There has been no progress in the investigation and those responsible for injuring Ali are yet to be brought to justice.
