Students detained for graffiti protest

Students Bayram and Giyas were angry with the Azerbaijani government, which strictly controls what people can do in the country. So they decided to protest by spraying a graffiti message on a statue of the former president. It read 'Happy slave day', a play on the slogan 'Happy Flower Day', which is celebrated on 10 May in Azerbaijan.

But after posting a photo of the graffiti on Facebook, Bayram and Giyas were arrested. The police falsely accused them of having illegal drugs and beat them up until they 'confessed'. We believe they were actually arrested because of their graffiti protest.

On 25 October Giyas was sentenced to 10 years in prison. Bayram's court hearing continues – he could face a similar sentence if found guilty.





SOLIDARITY ACTION
