Think Points

Image 1- Making Ends Meet:

What can you see in this image?
How would you feel if this happened to the street that you lived on?
What would you do in this situation to help to rebuild things?
How is this market different to the one you shop at? Why do you think it is different? Why are there still market traders out in this area?



Image 2- Schools Out:

How would you feel if this happened to a school that you know/ all of your hard work was destroyed?
Why have school classes moved underground? What does this say about the resilience of the Syrian children?
1 in 5 schools are damaged/ destroyed/used as shelters why is this such a problem for students?

Image 3- The White Helmets:

What questions would you want to ask the white helmets if they were in this room?
Why do you think unarmed volunteers risk their lives to save people they do not know?
How do you think the white hats provide hope to everyday Syrians?
What challenges do you think the white helmets face when going to the scene of a barrel bomb?



Image 4- Body of Evidence:

What do you notice in this picture?
Why is it important to document attacks on everyday Syrians?
How has the 360 project helped to give the Syrian people a voice internationally?
Why do you think that people still live in this area?
