ENFORCED DISAPPEARANCE OF HUMAN RIGHTS LAWYER


Human rights laywer Khalil Ma'touq has been missing since October 2012. He set off on his usual drive to work but never arrived.

Given his job defending hundreds of political prisoners and prisoners of conscience and the number of government-controlled checkpoints on his route, there were immediate concerns he'd been arrested.

Since then, Khalil's friends and family have been tipped off by various unofficial sources about him being held by a number of different security branches. The last reports received in September 2013 place him in the notorious Palestine Branch, a detention and interrogation centre in Damascus run by Military Intelligence.

For Khalil this detention is particularly dangerous as he suffers from advanced lung disease.

In your letter:

- State that Amnesty International believes Khalil Ma'touq is a prisoner of conscience who should be released unconditionally.
- Urge the Syrian authorities to disclose to his family his fate, whereabouts and legal status.
- Ask them to ensure that Khalil is protected from torture and ill-treatment, and granted immediate access to his family and a lawyer of his choice, and all necessary medical attention.
