JUSTICE FOR THE BHOPAL COMMUNITIES

This year will mark the 30th anniversary of the 1984 catastrophic gas leak in Bhopal, India – but still no one has been held to account.

It is estimated that between 7,000-10,000 people died within three days of the leak, and more than 570,000 people were exposed to damaging levels of toxic gas. But the disaster continues. The surrounding communities scrape a living each day, battling ill health and ongoing pollution.

Tens of thousands of people still suffer from serious health problems including children born to gas-affected parents. The health of women has been particularly affected. The factory lies abandoned with toxic waste untreated inside. Some 40,000 people still living next to the factory are at risk of serious pollution.

Attempts to obtain effective remedies for a gross abuse of human rights have so far been unsuccessful.
